History: Sally and Forrest Hoglund created The Hoglund Foundation in 1989 as a way to help others and give back to their community. Since its inception, the Foundation has grown dramatically, and has contributed more than \$48 million in funding to more than 500 agencies.

Mission: To improve the lives of at-risk children and families in the City of Dallas, Texas by partnering with organizations that provide education and family support services.

Primary Focus: To make a positive and measurable impact in the community. We favor programs that nurture, recognize and reward individual and family initiative and responsibility. Creative problem-solving and collaboration are encouraged.

Education:

- To deliver systemic improvement through cost effective and scalable initiatives that focus on data-driven results.
- To enhance the learning process of individuals through classroom and teacher support.

Family Support Services:

- To help families remain intact whenever possible by providing resources and training to promote family stability.
- To support the developmental and emotional needs of children with an emphasis on child abuse prevention.

2016 Major Grants:

Community Partners – Serving more than 20,000 children annually, Community Partners of Dallas offers five unique programs to help ensure safety, restore dignity and inspire hope for abused and neglected children served by Dallas County Child Protective Services. Their programs for caseworkers, children and families include: Rainbow Room, A Kid in Crisis, The Heart Program, Caseworker Appreciation, and StoryLine. The Hoglund Foundation is a proud sponsor of Community Partners “A Forever Home for Community Partners of Dallas” capital campaign that will provide funding for a new building and ongoing programs. www.cpdtx.org

Interfaith Family Services - The gift from The Hoglund Foundation will assist Interfaith Family Services with building a new Family Empowerment Center that will help an additional 200 families a year who are in crisis and on the brink of becoming homeless. This innovative new center will provide financial coaching, career development services, and counseling that low-income parents need to fight poverty in their new Adult Education building. The Center will also house Childcare & Youth Services that will empower children ages 0 to 18 through educational activities, tutoring, art, and play therapy. Additionally, Interfaith's new center will house a childcare facility providing much-needed services on evening and weekends which is the only time many working poor parents can access the services and training needed to increase their income levels. www.interfaithdallas.org

2016 Grant Highlights:

Reasoning Mind - Reasoning Mind develops web-based math programs for Pre K-7th grade students. Over 125,000 students use the organization’s programs, including more than 30,000 in Dallas ISD. A variety of school districts along with private and charter schools across Texas use Reasoning Mind. To date, more than 6,500 teachers have received professional training with more than 170,000 hours of professional development. Since 2008, Reasoning Mind has created more than 120 jobs in Texas. www.reasoningmind.org

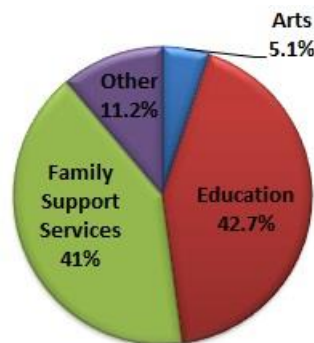
TexProtects - TexProtects reduces and prevents child abuse and neglect through research, advocacy, and education. They focus on educating legislators, private funders and the public on current issues related to the prevention, protection, and healing of abused and neglected children in Texas. TexProtects conducts comprehensive research on the Child Protective Services system. The research is used to identify issues and evidence-based solutions, recognize best practices, and create a legislative agenda prior to each legislative session. www.texprotects.org

Education Opens Doors - EOD empowers students to purposefully navigate through high school to college. They achieve this by partnering with middle and high schools to implement the Roadmap to Success Program, which provides students with the college knowledge and soft skills they need to achieve post-secondary success. The Roadmap to Success program, founded by a Dallas Teach for America alumna, has an interactive student manual with over 40 comprehensive lesson plans that are taught to students beginning in the 6th grade. www.educationopensdoors.org

Mosaic Family Services - Dallas based Mosaic Family Services provides culturally competent services to refugees and immigrants in crisis, including victims of domestic violence and human trafficking. Mosaic provides wraparound comprehensive services which include case management, legal services, counseling, emergency shelter, transitional housing, advocacy, education and outreach. Annually, over 11,000 people from 20 countries receive direct services while over 600,000 people are served through community outreach and education. www.mosaicservices.org
